2022 is a milestone year for water in Colorado.

It is the 100th anniversary of the Colorado River Compact; the 50th anniversary of the Clean Water Act; the 20th anniversary of Water Education Colorado; and the year when the 2015 Colorado Water Plan will be updated to continue our long history of ensuring high quality water to support our state's wide range of water uses and values. Water '22 is calling upon all Coloradans to come together to collectively meet the urgency of the moment.

WHEREAS, water is the lifeblood of Colorado upon which a high quality of life for all Coloradans is dependent; and

WHEREAS, water is one of Colorado's most important and precious natural resources as it is integral to our economic, social, and environmental well-being; and

 $W\!H\!E\!R\!E\!A\!S\!, Colorado\,\.'s\,rivers,\,lakes,\,and\,streams\,provide\,abundant\,recreational\,opportunities;\,and$

WHEREAS, plentiful water supplies are critical for agricultural production, and all water users should work together to supply the wide range of water needs; and

WHEREAS, Colorado is experiencing the very real impacts of climate change, battling historic drought conditions; and

WHEREAS, water owareness is a fundamental step in helping the citizens and residents of Colorado understand the risks to a sustainable water future and the need to work together innovatively to stretch scarce supplies, as outlined in the Colorado Water Plan; and

WHEREAS, the year 2022 is a milestone for water in Colorado: it is the 100th anniversary of the Colorado River Compact; the 50th anniversary of the Clean Water Act; the 85th anniversary of legislation that created the Colorado Water Conservation Board, the Colorado River Water Conservation District, and the Northern Colorado Water Conservancy District; and

WHEREAS, greater awareness of water issues can be achieved through community education, celebration and activation around shared stewardship:

THEREFORE, I, Jared Polis, Governor of the State of Colorado, do hereby proclaim 2022 as the



It all starts here, with YOU This is a call for submissions to the Water '22 Student Showcase, open to all K-12 students, ages 5-19, throughout Colorado. This free Student Showcase is designed to help young people connect with the value of water in daily life and the natural and built world around them, encourage critical thinking, and emphasize the crucial role young people will play as future water leaders who can help identify solutions for water sustainability. The deadline for submissions is October 1, 2022, at 11:59 PM.

Using whichever medium interests you most, we invite you to create a work that reflects a place, thing, or activity you cherish within your watershed, or river basin, connected to water. This place, thing, or activity could be a favorite park, an animal population that lives in the neighborhood, a hobby, a landscape feature, or a local business that is dependent on water, to name a few. You must also include a paragraph (up to 300 words) explaining the relationship obteween their work and the following learning objectives.

Entrants will submit their work for the Water '22 Student Showcase via the online portal. We accept submissions in English or Spanish.

Notable Colorado artists, writers, and water professionals will judge submitted work. All entrants will receive a certificate. Top entrants will receive a prize. The top submissions and entrants from each Age Division and Category will also be showcased across the state using a variety of online platforms and in local venues.

We are encouraging Coloradans to start by learning where there water comes from as a first step in understanding why their actions matter.

22 Ways To Care for Colorado Water in 2022

Know your water

1. Go to the source

What river or groundwater source are you drinking? Find out where your water comes from to understand why your actions matter.

Conserve water indoors

2. Lessen up while you freshen up

Shorten showers and turn off water while you brush and shave.

3. Make appliances do the dirty work

Use dishwashers and washing machines instead of handwashing and run with full loads.

4. Save water during food prep

Defrost foods in the fridge and compost waste instead of using disposal.

5. Lose the leaks

Fix running toilets and faucet drips.

6. Toss trash. don't flush it!

Trash, don't flush tissues or insects.

7. Use WaterSense low-flow fixtures

Install low-flow showerheads and faucet aerators, and look for the EPA's WaterSense label on appliances and fixtures.

Conserve water outdoors

8. Go native and limit turf

Replace thirsty grass with xeriscape landscaping.

9. Water at dawn or dusk

Water during cooler hours and avoid run-off.

10. Be sprinkler smart

Install drip irrigation, rotary nozzles and smart systems, then program seasonally.

11. Skip the crewcut on grass

Keep lawns at least 3" tall to retain moisture.

12. When it rains, use it!

Skip watering if it rains or is about to, and use rain barrels to capture rain for later use.

13. Sweep, don't spray

Use a broom, not a hose to clear sidewalks and driveways.

14. Use your voice

Talk to your property manager, HOA and local government or utility about smart outdoor watering practices.

Protect water quality

15. Go commercial to shine up your wheels Wash your car at a commercial car wash where the water is recycled.

16. Scoop the poop and can litter

Pick up after your pet and keep trash out of waterways.

17. Don't P on your lawn

Use only slow-release, phosphorus-free fertilizer to prevent algae growth in rivers.

18. Keep streets clean of auto fluids

Fix leaky auto fluids to keep them off roads and out of rivers.

19. Let only rain down storm drains

Don't dump anything into storm sewers, which drain directly to rivers.

20. Got ice? Curb the salt

Manually clear icy walks and driveways, then use sand, not salt, sparingly and sweep up after ice melts.

21. Install a rain garden

Install a rain garden for beautiful effects and improved stormwater management.


