


Purpose and Role of the Southwestern Water Conservation District

- Created in 1941 by the Colorado General Assembly
- For the purpose of leading in the conservation, use, and development of the water resources of the San Juan and Dolores rivers and their tributaries and provided with such powers necessary to safeguard for Colorado all waters to which the state of Colorado is equitably entitled
- Encompasses all or parts of nine counties in southwestern Colorado



Purpose and Role of the Southwestern Water Conservation District

- One of only four Conservation Districts created by the Colorado legislature
- Each with a similar statutory charge.

Purpose and Role of the Southwestern Water Conservation District

- Only two of the Conservation Districts are located within the Colorado River Basin
- Collectively, the Southwestern Water Conservation
 District and the Colorado River Water Conservation
 District encompass all of the lands west of the
 Continental Divide

Recent Areas of Engagement Across State Lines

- Ongoing discussions with stakeholders in the Basin, including:
 - the Upper Colorado River Commission
 - State of Colorado
 - Colorado River Water Conservation District

 Drought Contingency Planning, including exploration of demand management


Recent Areas of Engagement Across State Lines

 Continued technical work geared towards identifying risks to Lake Powell and Upper Basin water users, including within Colorado

 Ongoing financial support towards, and participation in, the San Juan River Basin Recovery Program

Recent Areas of Engagement within Colorado

- Monitor activities related to transmountain water rights that may impact water supply within the District's boundaries
- Participate, as necessary, in water court cases.



Recent Areas of Engagement within Colorado

 Continue to support development and protection of Colorado's compact entitlements within southwestern Colorado through operation of the District's annual grant program





Recent Areas of Engagement within Colorado

 Actively monitor and, as appropriate, take positions on proposed federal and state legislation that may impact water use or development within the District.

Next Steps

- Continue to be engaged and help inform Colorado River Basin discussions at all levels, including re-negotiation of the interim guidelines
- Ongoing technical efforts to better understand:
 - water supplies and demands within the District; and
 - potential risks to water supplies and future development
- Participate in the State and Division Engineers' promulgation of measurement rules within Water Divisions 4 and 7.
- Work collaboratively and creatively with other stakeholders within Colorado and the larger Colorado River Basin to find solutions to ongoing and emerging issues
